# YOUTH IMPACTING YOUTH

LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT WORKS AS YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROFESSIONAL

When high school senior and local football player, Ethan Myers walked into Boys & Girls Club, Miller Freedom Center, on his first day of work, a Club member was quick to ask where he played football. When Myers replied with Yulee High School, the Club member was fast to tell him that his older brother's team had beat them earlier in the football season. Immediately, Myers realized that this job was going to be unlike the one he had held before at Sonic, the fast-food restaurant, and almost **immediately fell in love with the unique opportunity to work with youth**, something he watched his mother do in her profession his whole life.

Myers is a part of the On-The-Job-Training (OJT) Program at Yulee High School which allows students to use **real-world work experience** to get credit hours towards their degree. Now, Myers serves as a Youth Development Professional for Sports at Miller Freedom Center. When asked about his favorite part of the job, Myers explained, "it's the impact I have on the kids." He went on to say that he has learned a valuable lesson throughout this opportunity about how everyone comes from a different background, and it is important to consider that when working with youth.

Unfortunately, Boys & Girls Clubs will be saying goodbye to Myers this summer as he will be starting at Hutchinson Community College in Kansas, where he signed to play college football. **Myers expressed that part of his motivation in his next steps comes directly from Club members** who want to see him on the next Madden and play football in college, the Club members seeming to inspire Myers as much as he is inspiring them.

Youth of the Year is the highest honor in Boys & Girls Clubs, and helps foster a new generation of leaders, fully prepared to live and lead in a diverse, global and integrated world economy. This program celebrates the extraordinary achievements of Club members.

Poindexter is also the winner of the 2025 David & Betty Berkman scholarship which was awarded at the 18th Annual BGCNCF Gala February 14. 2025.
